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Report from the Board of Trustees

The Annual Report offers us a valuable opportunity to share our achievements and reflect on the progress we've made. In the time since the last Annual Report, much has changed, and the ISM community has a lot to celebrate.

The 2023–2024 academic year has been a landmark chapter in the 30-year history of the International School of Monaco (ISM). As Trustees of the Association, the Board is pleased to present this Annual Report, which reflects not only the school's academic accomplishments, but also the collective progress made by our vibrant and engaged community.

ISM is more than a school—it is an Association that is governed by the Board of Trustees, united by a shared vision to provide every student with an exceptional education in a safe, supportive, and inclusive environment. The Trustees, composed primarily of parents and supported by up to three non-parent members, carry the responsibility of safeguarding this vision while ensuring that students remain at the heart of every decision.

This year marked several transformative milestones. Most notably, ISM achieved the distinguished status of a full IB World Continuum School. This achievement, a reflection of years of strategic effort, enhances both the academic standing of the school and the lifelong opportunities for our students.

Our graduating class of 2024 exceeded global benchmarks, with a remarkable average IB score of 35.7—well above the world average—and one student achieving a perfect score of 45. These academic results are complemented by outstanding university placements at institutions such as Oxford, Columbia, Imperial College, and the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania. This success is a testament to the hard work of our students, the dedication of our teaching staff, and the support of our parent community.

Beyond academics, ISM's commitment to well-being remains unwavering. The school earned the prestigious Optimus Wellbeing Award, following a rigorous evaluation of mental health, physical health, and the overall school environment. The Board continues to prioritize the implementation of robust safeguarding and well-being policies.

The move to our state-of-the-art new campus at Testimonio II was a defining moment. This transition represents a significant leap forward for ISM and ensures that our students and staff benefit from a modern, purpose-built educational environment. It would not have been possible without the dedication of the school's leadership and staff, and the ongoing support of our families.

Our strategic partnerships continue to deliver tangible benefits. Our collaboration with King's College School, Wimbledon entered its fourth year, with renewed terms focused on quality assurance and professional development. Likewise, the partnership with the World Academy of Sports and the successful launch of the IBCP Sports Management track have expanded the horizons for students with diverse talents and aspirations.

The Board has also advanced several critical initiatives this year, including a review and update of many school policies, the negotiation and renewal of our rental lease with the Monaco Government, and the initiation of a new five-year Strategic Plan. This plan will be shaped by open consultation with the broader community, in line with our commitment to transparency and collective responsibility.

We would like to thank the PTA, who continues to enrich our school life this year through their commitment and creativity, our teachers and staff members for their tireless dedication, and, most importantly, our amazing students!

And finally, we thank the Members of the Association, for their continued trust and support. It was a privilege to serve the International School of Monaco this year.

REPORT FROM THE DIRECTOR



International Education with Distinction

Excellence - Wellbeing - Multilingualism

It gives me great pleasure, once again, to write a few words of introduction for our Annual Report for 2023-2024.

I am sure you will agree that the pages that follow demonstrate that 2023-2024 was a tremendously successful year in which our vision of international education with distinction was reinforced and consolidated in the life of the school on a whole variety of levels.

Our students throughout the entire ISM community continued to make us very proud, with numerous accolades being achieved in all aspects of international education.

We were particularly fortunate to have enriched our educational experience with numerous visits from external experts in a wide variety of fields, including notable academics from the universities of St Andrews, Warwick and Bath, experts and disruptors in education, such as Alex Beard from The Learning Revolution and David Harkin from 8billionideas and, of course, continued close collaboration with our colleagues from King's College School Wimbledon International, amongst others.

We were also delighted that 2023-2024 marked a culmination and confirmation of all our school development work over the past few years, with an absolutely outstanding evaluation report from the Council of International Schools (CIS).

In light of the above achievement, I think that there is no better way to continue this introduction than to remind you of the major conclusions from this important CIS evaluation report, which really summed up the continued progress that the school has made through the dedicated commitment of its staff, huge and greatly appreciated support from its parents and wise guidance from the Board of Trustees.

Throughout the CIS report, which was received in January 2024, the following strengths of ISM were emphasised:

- a talented, passionate, and hard-working board that cares about all aspects of the student experience and puts the quality of learning and teaching at the heart of its work;
- a professional, knowledgeable, and dedicated senior leadership team, all of whom are constantly prepared to go the extra mile for all members of the school community;
- a highly committed staff that enjoys its work and will always put the needs of students first;
- a passionate and committed PTA, developing a strong parent community focused on creating inclusive opportunities for students;
- a strong, effective, and inclusive approach to all matters related to well-being, safeguarding, and child protection;
- a working environment where all stakeholders value each other and focus on the importance of trust, openness, and respect;
- and a well-developed strategic planning process that is linked to the school's guiding statements, responds to feedback from the community and external partners, utilises action plans, and is carefully monitored and reviewed throughout each planning cycle.

The quality of this report was even more significant given the fact that ISM continued to move forward with a significant number of other strategic priorities, including seeking authorisation from the International Baccalaureate (IB) to offer the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP) and IB Middle Years Programme (MYP) in order to become an all-though IB World Continuum School.

The quality of these evaluation reports was equally impressive and it was fantastic for the school to achieve full IB World Continuum School status in time for the move of the whole school community to our Testimonio II school facility. This authorisation, together with the accreditation from the World Academy of Sport as an Athlete Friendly Education Centre, places the ISM in the top 1% of all IB schools worldwide and makes it unique in the world as a English/French bilingual school achieving such a high level of recognition. Moreover, the dedication of the entire school community in prioritising wellbeing and pastoral care was recognised by the school's achievement of the Optimus Wellbeing Award in June 2024, which involved the meeting of no fewer than 63 rigorous wellbeing KPIs, which impacted all aspects of the operation of the school.

Whilst an ISM education is so much more than just external examination results, we were delighted with the achievements of both our Year 11 and Year 13 students in these external benchmarks. In particular, our Year 13 graduating class achieved an IB average of close to 36 points, which was one of the highest scores above the worldwide average in the history of ISM. This was even more impressive given the fact that over 20% of these results were at 40 points or above out of 45, with no fewer than 9 students achieving this prestigious score, with both a perfect 45 and a 44 points score. There is no surprise, therefore, that these students also achieved one of the most impressive sets of university offers and placements in the history of the school, including University of Oxford, Columbia University, University of Pennsylvania, London School of Economics, and University College London, University of St Andrews among many other impressive offers and placement in the UK, USA and Europe.

Indeed, a significant aspect of the 2023-24 academic year consisted of our detailed planning and preparations for all aspects of the move to our new school facility at Testimonio II. This included not only equipment and furnishing procurement but also significant and detailed educational planning, safeguarding and wellbeing reviews, health and safety and risk management audits and all the logistics regarding the support services in the new building. This dedication and commitment from the Board of Trustees, SLT and staff resulted in a seamless transition to the new school in September 2024, which all members of our ISM community were incredibly proud of.

Finally, we were delighted that all our achievements of 2023-2024 were recognised by the continued highly prestigious ranking of ISM as one of the best schools in Europe and globally, in both the Spear's and Carfax indexes of the best schools in the world. This is truly something to be proud of and is a wonderful hallmark of the success of the school.

As you will be aware, this year also marks the culmination of 30 years of impressive development of ISM and we look forward to celebrating this notable milestone throughout the 2024-2025 academic year.




Professional Learning

The start of the 2023-24 academic year saw the introduction of our new Professional Learning Policy. This policy underscores our shift from traditional professional development to a more dynamic and holistic approach to professional learning, fostering a culture of continuous improvement and collaboration among all staff members. Unlike professional development, which often focuses on isolated skill acquisition, professional learning emphasises ongoing reflective and collaborative processes that integrate seamlessly into daily practice.

This year, our professional learning initiatives have concentrated on the Primary Years Programme (PYP) and the Middle Years Programme (MYP). Recognising the importance of these programs in shaping well-rounded, globally-minded students, we have ensured that all staff members receive comprehensive training in PYP and MYP. This focus aligns with our commitment to delivering high-quality, inquiry-based education that empowers students to become active, compassionate and lifelong learners.

The dedication to PYP and MYP this year has been impressive. Our teachers have embraced innovative teaching strategies, integrated interdisciplinary units and fostered a collaborative learning environment. Our PYP/MYP focused Teach Meet also enables staff to share their goals and strategies across the school and demonstrates an impressive amount of knowledge and teaching and learning talents. The impact of their efforts is evident in the enriched educational experiences provided to our students, promoting critical thinking, creativity and intercultural understanding.




